

To celebrate what friends really mean, a day was set apart. The US Congress in 1935 made a Proclamation, and the first Sunday of August was declared as a holiday in the USA, in honour of friends. The General Assembly of the United Nations on 27th April, 2011, declared 30th July as official International Friendship Day. India and several other countries, celebrate Friendship Day on the first Sunday of August.

In the Company of Jesus, the Friend

"My best friend is the one who brings out the best in me," said Henry Ford. A closer look at the Gospels and above all at those who came in close contact with Jesus is more than sufficient to offer us loving glimpses of Jesus' style of entering into relationships. Once Fr. Ricardo Tonelli, a Professor of Youth Pastoral, and a great friend of young people, said: "It looked as though Jesus was getting closer to people and assuring them: son, daughter, brother, sister, do not be afraid, you can stand straight and walk courageously because my Father loves you. Yes, indeed, that is exactly what Jesus did. He helped those who lost their dignity to regain it and to find sense and meaning in their life."

His non-judgmental attitude, fire-side warmth, gentleness, tenderness, the "hound of heaven" seeking desperately to offer forgiveness, to any and everyone, and a "listening-dialogue," made the Samaritan woman plead: "Sir, give me this water, so that, I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water" (Jn. 4:15).

An unknown quote reveals a great deal of wisdom, "Friends are the most important ingredient in the recipe of life." As a trendsetter of friendships, Jesus was able to grasp what was not working in the person, and holding firm to His conviction of the Father's unconditional love,

he indicated to those whom He encountered, a new path that would ensure peace, joy and integrity. Jesus went far beyond, to allow the inner beauty of the person to shine forth: charm, grace, elegance, comeliness and exquisiteness. He gave His treasured time to listen, to heal, to comfort, and offer mercy. Thus, those who placed their trust in the Son of God and man, were able to bounce back to a life of exuberance, newness and renewed freshness. 
Devasahayam Pillai becomes first Indian layman to be declared Saint by Pope Francis

The devout Catholic community of India has thrown up yet another saint. Devasahayam Pillai, who was born a Hindu and embraced Christianity in the 18th century became the first Indian layman to be declared a saint by Pope Francis on 15th May 2022.

Pope Francis, 85, canonised Blessed Devasahayam during the Canonisation Mass held

in St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican attended by over 50,000 faithful from all over the world as well as government delegations, honouring 10 new saints. During the impressive canonisation ceremony, the Holy Father renewed his appeal to world leaders that they may be "protagonists of peace and not of war."

Born on April 23, 1712, Neelakanta Pillai hailed from a Hindu Nair upper caste Brahmin family in Nattalam village in Kanyakumari district, then a part of the erstwhile Travancore kingdom



(present day Tamil Nadu). When he converted to Christianity in 1745, Pillai then assumed the name 'Lazarus' or Devasahayam in Malayalam, which means 'God is my help'.

Devasahayam preached for the equality of all people, despite caste differences, which piqued the hatred of the higher classes. He was arrested in 1749. After

enduring increasing hardships, he was shot dead in the Aralvaimozhy forest on January 14, 1752.

Devasahayam was recommended for the process of Beatification by the Vatican in 2004, at the request of the Kottar diocese, Tamil Nadu Bishops' Council and the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India.

A miracle attributed to Devasahayam was recognised by Pope Francis in 2014, clearing the path to his canonisation in 2022.

Indian Christian Day celebrated

To mark the 1950th martyrdom day of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Christians cutting across denominations came together in various

parts of India on 3rd July 2022, to organise special programmes.

Saint Thomas, one of the 12 apostles of Lord Jesus Christ, is believed to have come to India in 52 AD and preached the Christian faith in the southern regions of the country. He was martyred 20 years later in Chennai, the capital of the southern Indian state of Tamil Nadu.

Since 2021, the day is being observed as the Indian Christian Day to "love

the neighbour, serve society, celebrate Jesus and bless India."

The ecumenical annual day helps Christians to remember and celebrate "the person and message of Lord Jesus Christ in India."

The day also helps them preserve their identity with the Indian cultural heritage and promoting unity.

The day saw Christians organising festivities, cultural and community service programmes, health and literacy camps, food and clothes drive, environmental clean-ups and workshops.

Bigger role for women in Church

From 2020 the Pope has been including women in the Roman Curia offering them admin level positions. Last year the Pope appointed Sister Raffaella Petrini, to the number two position in the Vatican City Governorate, making her the first woman to hold the position.

In a recent interview, Pope Francis shared his plans to expand the role of women in the Roman Curia, and announced his intention to appoint two women to the Dicastery that assists the Pontiff in the selection of bishops.

Pope Francis mentioned that in the future he sees the possibility of lay people being appointed to lead certain Vatican departments such as the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life, the Dicastery for Culture and Education, or the Vatican Apostolic Library.


Chalk and cheese, though different keys, unlock relevant doors, with ease: The word 'Adwitiyah' is a Sanskrit word meaning



Agnel Region of the Society of Pilar congratulates Archbishop Filipe Neri Ferrao of Goa and Daman, on his appointment as Cardinal



Archbishop Filipe Neri Antonio Sebastiao di Rosario Ferrao, Archbishop of Goa and Daman, has been chosen by Pope Francis to be made a Cardinal. He is one of the 21 Bishops to be chosen to be made a Cardinal, at a Consistory on 27th August, at the Vatican.

The Most Reverend Ferrao became the firstever archbishop of Goa to be elevated to the cardinalate in 465 years and is only the sixth person of Goan origin to attain the rank.

Filipe Ferrao is one of two Indian prelates, the other being archbishop of Hyderabad Anthony Poola, taking the total number of Indian cardinals to six. The other four serving Cardinals in India being Cleemis Catholicos (Trivandrum), Telesphore Toppo (Ranchi), Oswald Gracias (Mumbai) and George Alencherry (Ernakulam).

Born in Aldona on 20th January, 1953, he studied at the seminary in Pune and was ordained a priest of the archdiocese on 28th October, 1979. Sent to Rome, he earned a degree in biblical theology from the Pontifical Urbanian University before going to Belgium for further studies in catechesis and pastoral theology at the Lumen Vitae International Institute.

He was Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Goa and Daman from 1994 to 2004. He was appointed Archbishop-Patriarch on 21st March, 2004 and appointed Metropolitan on 25th November, 2006. He was elected Chairman of the Western Region Committee for Catechetics on December, 2012 and Chairman of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC) Office of Education and Faith Formation in January 2016.

Presently he is also holding the responsibility as President of Conference of Catholic Bishops of India and member of the Central Committee of FABC since February 2019.

When appointed Cardinal, Filipe Ferrao will be entitled to participate in a conclave that will eventually find Pope Francis a successor. The 'red hats' as they are often called due to the colour of their zucchetto (skullcap), also serve as key papal advisors and as members of Vatican offices and councils.
